
TomTom WORK truck navigation

1. Truck Navigation

When planning a route for a large vehicle such as a truck or a bus, TomTom WORK truck navigation helps you to avoid potential hazards such as low bridges.

Important: You must pay attention to all traffic signs, especially those relating to your vehicle's dimensions and weight. We cannot guarantee you will never encounter them on your route and ignoring such restrictions can be dangerous.

For countries where truck-specific information is included in the map, truck navigation takes this into account together with your vehicle profile.

The enhanced truck navigation routing also works independently of the truck-specific map information. It favours major roads, assumes you are travelling at a lower average speed and also selects routes without sharp turns.

Note: *Enhanced truck navigation routing only works with a truck map.*

Setting a vehicle profile

To use truck navigation, you need to set your vehicle profile. A vehicle profile is a collection of information about the vehicle you are driving or planning a route for.

To set your profile in the Preferences menu, follow the steps below.

1. Tap the screen to bring up the Main Menu.
2. Tap **Change preferences**.
3. Tap **Change vehicle profile**.
4. Tap the vehicle type that you are using for this journey.



5. If you selected the bus or truck profile for your vehicle, you can then set the following information:
 - Vehicle weight and weight per axle
 - Vehicle length, height and width
 - Vehicle maximum speed

The next time you plan a trip, a route that is suitable for your vehicle will be calculated.

Note: *If no large vehicle route is possible, you are warned and offered a car route instead.*

You can also change your vehicle profile when planning an itinerary or when planning a route as described below.

Plan your route in the normal way and after choosing an address option, you'll see a screen with your current vehicle profile. Tap **Change** to change it.



Viewing blocked truck routes

If your vehicle profile is set to truck, you can see when a road is blocked due to truck-related restrictions on the map.

The blocked road sections are coloured in purple as shown below and indicate potential hazards for trucks such as low bridges.



You can see blocked truck routes in the map browser, the route summary screen and when indicating a map correction on the map.

TomTom Map Share™

With TomTom Map Share, you can correct errors on your map and share those corrections with other people in the TomTom Map Share community, as well as receiving corrections made by others.



If you find a street that has recently been blocked to traffic which was open before, you can use Map Share to correct your map and then share the correction with other Map Share users.

You can use Map Share to send and receive map corrections during the first year after the map's release date. This means that one year after the release date, you will no longer be able to send or receive map corrections for that version of the map. You will still be able to make corrections to your own map for use on your own device.

You choose the type of corrections you want and each time you connect your TomTom GO to TomTom HOME, the map is automatically updated.

Note: TomTom Map Share is not available in all regions. For more information, go to tomtom.com/mapshare.

TomTom Map Share™ for trucks

There are now some types of map corrections that specifically apply only to trucks. Map corrections made when using a truck profile are not applicable when using another profile, for example, a car profile.



To make a correction to your map, tap **Map corrections** in the Main Menu then tap **Correct a map error**.

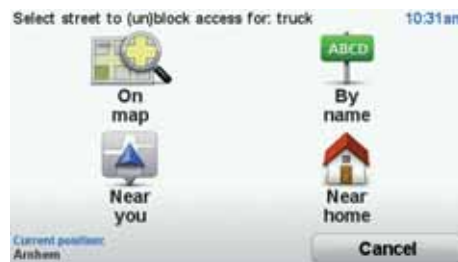


(Un)block street for truck

Tap this button to block or unblock a street for a truck in one or both directions.

For example, to correct a street near to your current location, do the following:

1. Tap **(Un)block street for truck**.
2. Tap **Near you** to select a street near your current location. You can select a street by name, a street near your Home location or a street on the map.



3. Select the street or section of a street you want to correct by tapping it on the map.

The street you select is highlighted and the cursor shows the name of the street.



4. Tap **Done**.

Your device shows the street and whether the traffic is blocked or allowed for trucks in each direction.

If you come across a bridge and a height restriction is missing in one direction, you can add this information to the map.



If multiple restrictions apply, tap **View all** to see all the Northbound and Southbound truck restrictions. Tap **Back** to continue. You can then choose which restrictions are applicable for each direction as explained below.



5. Tap one of the direction buttons to block or unblock the flow of traffic in that direction or to change the restrictions.

6. Tap **Yes** when asked if you want to remove the existing restriction.



7. If you changing a restriction, select the applicable restriction and enter the correct value.



8. Tap **Yes** or **No** to choose whether you want to apply the same restriction to the other side of the street.

9. Tap **Done**.

The next time you connect your device to TomTom HOME, your corrections are shared with the TomTom Map Share community.



Change turn restrictions for trucks

Tap this button to change and report incorrect road turn directions for trucks.



Change road speed for trucks

Tap this button to change and report the road speed limit for trucks.
